# PART I Historical Statement

# HISTORICAL STATEMENT

I. Near the close of the nineteenth century, a movement for the system and conservation of scriptural holimess in organized church form developed almost simultaneously in various parts of the United States. This movement was similar to the Weleyan revival of the previous century. The manifestation everywhere of a spontaneous drawing in the unity of the Spirit cuminsted finally in the organization of the Pentecostal Church of the Nazeree.

The great impulse of this movement has been the emphasis placed by the Scriptures upon the fact that, in the atonement, Jesus Christ has made provision, not only to save men from their sins, but also to perfect them in love.

II. On May 12, 1886, a number of the brethren in Providence, R.I., interested in promoting the Wesleyan doctrine and experience of entire sanctification, organized and held weekly religious services, first in private homes, but after a few months in a rented store on Oxford Street, On January 16, 1887, a Sunday school was organized with 95 members. On July 21, 1887, the People's Evangelical Church was organized with 51 members, Rev. F.A. Hillery acting as pastor. On November 25, 1888, the Mission Church, Lynn, Mass., was organized with Rev. C. Howard Davis as pastor. On March 13 and 14, 1890, representatives from these churches and other evangelical holiness organizations in southern New England assembled at Rock, Mass., and organized the Central Evangelical Holiness Association. III. In October, 1896, a number of persons, under the leadership of Rev. Phines R. Presee, D.D., and J. P. Widney, M.D., formed the Finst Church of the Nazarene at Los Angeles, Calif, with 35 charter members. They adopted statements of belief, and agreed to such general rules as seemed proper and needful for their immediate guidance, leaving to the future the making of such provisions as the work and organization a number of churches sprang into arsistence, reaching as far east as Chicano.

IV. As the group from the East and the group from the West came to know each other better, the feeling grew that they should unite. After delegates from both areas had conferred, the following basis of union was prepared and adopted unanimously by both bodies:

BASIS OF UNION

It is agreed that the two churches are one in the doctrines considered sensitil to assistion, especially the doctrines of justification by faith and entire sanctification subsequent to justification, also by faith, and as a result, the precious experience of entire sanctification as a normal condition of the churches. Both churches recognize that the right of church membership resty upon experience and that persons who have been born of the Spirit are entitled to its privileges.

We are agreed on the necessity of a superintendency, which shall foster and care for churches already established and whose duty it shall be to organize and encourage the organizing of churches everywhere.

We are agreed that authority given to superintendents shall not interfere with the independent action of a fully organized church, each church enjoying the right of selecting its own paster, subject to such approval as the General Assembly shall find wise to institute; the detiction of delegates to the various asinstitute; the detiction of delegates to the various asof all other things pertaining to their local life and web.

It is agreed that any church of the Association of Pentecostal Churches of America going into this cognanization which may feel it imperative with them to continue to hold their property in like manner as at present, shall be at liberty to do so.

The first union assembly was held in Chicago in October, 1907. It was agreed that the name of the united body should be The Pentecostal Church of the Nazarene.

In 1901 the first Independent Holiness church was organized at Van Alsyne, Tex., by Rev. C. B. Jernigan. This denomination grew and prospered until, in 1903, there were 20 church organizations. The legal representatives of the Independent

Holiness church and the New Testament Church of Christ met at Rising Star, Tex., in November, 1904, where a joint committee framed a Manual and statement of doctrine and basis of union. The union was fully consummed at Pilot Point, Tex., in November, 1905, and the united body adopted the name Holiness Church of Christ.

VI. In 1907 several representatives from the Holiness Church of Christ accepted the invitation of the Pentecostal Church of the Nazarene to attend its the Pentecostal Church of the Nazarene to attend its General Assembly in Chicago, but were not authorized to take any action with reference to organic union. After the assembly invited them into counsel, provisional arrangements were made to in-corporate the two churches into one body, when proper action could be taken. Upon the invitation of the Holiness Church of Christ, the Second General Assembly convened at Pilot Point, Tex., at two o'clock Thursday afternoon, October 8, 1908. On the following Tuesday morning, R. B. Mitchum moved: "That the union of the two churches be now consummated," and the motion was seconded by Rev. C. W. Ruth, Reys, John N. Short, J. B. Creighton, C. B. Jernigan, H. B. Hosley, P. F. Bresee, and others spoke favorably regarding the motion. On Tuesday, October 13, 1908, at 10:40 a.m., amid great enthusiasm, the motion to unite was adopted by a unanimous rising vote.

VII. In 1898 Rev. J. O. McClurkan and a few others called a meeting of the holiness people of Tennessee and adjacent states to be held in Nasiville. At this convention an association known as the Pentecostal Alliance was formed, but its name was later changed to the Pentecostal Mission. From the beginning these

people were evangelistic in spirit and had a burning denite to disseminate the doctrine and experience of sasctification. Thus in different sections of the South there came together groups of holiness people, known as lands of the Pentecostal Mission. IX. Justification, Regeneration, and Adoption

9. We believe that justification is the gracious and judicial act of God by which He grants full pardon of all guit and complete release from the penalty of sins committed, and acceptance as righteous, to all who believe on Jesus Christ and receive Him as Lord and Savioar.

10. We believe that regeneration, or the new birth, is that gracious work of God whereby the moral nature of the repeatant believer is spiritually quickened and given a distinctively spiritual life, capable of faith, love, and obelience.

 We believe that adoption is that gracious act of God by which the justified and regenerated believer is constituted a son of God.

12. We believe that justification, regeneration, and adoption are simultaneous in the experience of seekers after God and are obtained upon the condition of faith, preceded by repentance; and that to this work and state of grace the Holy Spirit bears witness. Late 18-14.

## X. Entire Sanctification

13. We believe that entire sanctification is that act of God, subsequent to regeneration, by which believers are made free from original sin, or depravity, and brought into a state of entire devotement to God, and the holy obedience of love made perfect.

It is wrought by the baptism with the Holy Spirit, and comprehends in one experience the cleansing of the heart from sin and the abiding induelling presence of the Holy Spirit, empowering the believer for life and service.

Entire sanctification is provided by the blood of Jesus, is wrought instantaneously by faith, preceded by entire consecration; and to this work and state of grace the Holy Spirit bears witness.

gave the roly Spint bears writes. This experience is also known by various terms representing its different phases, such as "Christian perfection," "perfect love," "heart purity," "the baptism with the Holy Spirit," "the fullness of the blessing," and "Christian holiness."

14. We believe that there is a marked distinction between a pure heart and a mature character. The former is obtained in an instant, the result of entire sanctification; the latter is the result of growth in grace.

We helieve that the grace of entire sanctification includes the impulse to grow in grace. However, this impulse must be consciously nurtured, and careful attention given to the requisites and processes of spiritual development and improvement in Christikeness of character and personality. Without such purposeful endeavor one's witness may be impaired and the grace isself frustrated and ultimately lost. 32 [[14]

### B. MARRIAGE AND DIVORCE AND/OR DISSOLUTION OF MARRIAGE

(The meaning of divorce in this rule shall include "dissolution of marriage" when it is used as a legal substitute for divorce.)

The Christian family, knit together in a common bond through Jesus Christ, is a circle of love, fellowship, and worship to be earnestly cultivated in a society in which family ties are easily dissolved. We urge upon the ministry and congregations of our church such teachings and practices as will strengthen and develou family ties.

### F. CHURCH OFFICERS

38. We direct our local churches to elect as church officers only persons who are clearly in the experience of entire sanctification; who are in full sympathy with the doctrines, polity, and practices of the Church of the Nazarese; and who support the local church faithfully with tithes and offerings. G. AMENDING SPECIAL RULES

39. The provisions of these Special Rules may be repealed or amended when concurred in by a twothirds vote of all the members of a given General Assembly.

# PREAMBLE TO GOVERNMENT

All life must have law; all organization must have government. He who is Hand over all things unto the Church bimself gave form and order unto His body of followers and representatives. We seek as a church to conform to principles of government in accord with Ho Hoy Scriptures and divine providences, that all things may be done scripturally, decently, and in order.

The government of the Church of the Nazarene is representative, and thus avoids the extremes of episcopacy on the one hand, and unlimited congregationalism on the other.

#### CHAPTER I

### THE LOCAL CHURCH

### A. Organization, Name, Incorporation, Property, Restrictions, Mergers, Disorganization

100. Organization. Local churches may be organized by the district superintendent, or by the general superintendent having jurisdiction, or by an elder authorized by either of them. Official reports of new churches shall be filed in the Department of Church Extension. [28, 2084.1, 310, 354, 404.11]

101. Name. The name of a newly organized church shall be determined by the local church in consultation with the district superintendent and with the approval of the District Advisory Board.

 101.1. Change of Name. A local Church of the Nazarene may change its name by a majority ballot vote in an annual or special meeting of the church 60 [[102]

tive church boards and provided the merger shall have been approved in writing by the district apprintendent, the District Advisory Board, and the general superintendent in jurisdiction. Upon the notification by the district superintendent, the general secretary of the Church of the Nazarene is authorized to remove the names of the inactive churches from the roll of churches.

The merger shall be finalized in a special meeting of the new congregation for the purpose of electing officers and making pastoral arrangements. The district superintendent, or an elder appointed by him, shall preside.

The organization thus created shall combine the total membership of the former churches, the membership of all departments of those churches, and the assets and liabilities of those churches, including budget allocations.

106. Disorgamination of Churches. A local church may be disorgamined by action and formal pronouncement of the Board of General Superintendents. Such action shall be taken only after (a) the district superintendent in juridiction concerning the passhall y of discontinuing a local church organization; dent and the District Advisor Board.

Members of missions, where the organization of a local church has not been effected, shall not be counted as church members nor reported as church members: however, members of a mission may, when duly received according to 107 and 107.1. hold church membership in some regularity of a church members. 108. Probationary Membership. Where a district makes provision (203.30), a local church may have probationers who shall have all the privileges of church members, with the exception of voting and holding church office. (203.30)

108.1. Probationers may be received into full membership or dropped at any time, at the discretion of the pastor and evangelism and church membership committee.

C. Evangelism and Church Membership Committee

109. The church board shall provide an evangelism and church membership committee of not fewer than three persons acting in an advisory capacity to the

109.7. To recommend to the church board, upon nomination by the pastor, the evangelists for local campaigns. It is recommended that at least one campaign each year be conducted by a commissioned or registered evangelist.

109.8. No person shall be received into full membership of the local church until the pastor first consults with the evangelism and church membership committee concerning that person's reception. [107.1]

D. Change of Membership

110. Transfer. The pastor, when requested by a member, may grant a transfer of church membership

The pastor, who shall be ex officio president of the local church, or the district superintendent, or the general superintendent having jurisdiction, or someone appointed by the district superintendent or the general superintendent, shall preside at annual or special church meetings. 112.5. Secretary. The secretary of the church board shall be the secretary of all church meetings; in his absence a secretary pro tempore shall be elected. [141.4]

### H. The Pastor

114. A postor is an elder or a licensed minister [122] who, under the call of God and His people, has the oversight of a local church, [38, 210]

115. The duties of a pastor are:

115.1. To preach the Word, [403.5, 404]

115.2. To receive persons as members of the local church according to 107 and 107.1.

115.3. To administer the sacraments in harmony with 403.6 and 404.

115.4. To care for the people by pastoral visitation, particularly of the sick and needy.

115.5. To comfort those who mourn.

115.6. To reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with all long-suffering and doctrine.

115.7. To seek, by all means, the conversion of sinners, the entire sanctification of the converted, and the upbuilding of God's people in the most holy faith. [24]

115.8. To have the care of all departments of local church work.

115.9. To appoint the teachers of the Sunday school in harmony with 162.3.

115.10. To administer the sacrament of the Lord's Supper at least once a quarter. A licensed minister who has not complied fully with provisions of 403.6 (see also 802), shall arrange for the administration of the sacrament by an elder. [33.5, 144.2]

115.11. To read to the congregation the Constitution of the Church of the Nazarene and the Special Rules contained in 1-26, 28-26, both inclusive, within each church year [113] or have this section of the Manual printed and distributed annually to the members of the church.

141.6. To send to the district superintendent a copy of minutes of all church meetings and meetings of church board within three days of such meetings when that local church is without a nearcor.

141.7. To sign in conjunction with the pastor all conveyances of real estate, mortgages, releases of meetpage, contracts, and other legal documents not otherwise provided for in the Manual. [102.1, 103-4.2]

142. Church Treasurer. The duties of the treasurer of the church board shall be:

142.1. To receive all moneys not otherwise provided for, and disburse the same only on order of the church board. [136.2]]

#### L. The Stewards

### M. The Local Stewardship Committee

147. The stewards shall constitute the stewardship committee, whose duty it shall be to promote the cause of Christian stewardship in the local church in cooperation with the pastor and the General Department of Stewardship, [37:37,4, 384-48,10]

### N. The Trustees

148. The trustees of the church shall be no fewer than three nor more than nine in number. They shall be elected from among the members of the local church to serve for the next church year and until their successors have been elected and qualified. [38, 112.8, 134]

149. In all cases where the civil law requires a specific mode of election of church trustees, that mode shall be strictly followed. [112.3]

149.1. Where no particular mode of election is required by civil law, the trusters shall be elected by

#### O. Christian Life and Sunday School

164. Christian Life and Sunday School is that division of the local church which plans, promotes, and directs the Christian education work of the local church, namely, the Sunday school; summer ministries, including the vacation Bible school; the weekday schools; Caravans; children's church; the Christian Service Training schools; youth ministries 90 [155]

in conjunction with NYI; adult ministries including Home Department; and such other schools and classee as may be classified under this heading. Christian Life and Sunday School shall be supervised by the Board of Christian Life and Sunday School under the direct care of the pastor.

155. The objectives of Christian Life and Sunday School are:

155.1. To teach the doctrines of Christianity and the standards of Christian behavior as revealed in the Bible, especially as interpreted by the "Articles of Faith" in the Manual of the Church of the Nazarene.

155.2. To lay the foundation and begin the development of Christian character in young children. 155.3. To seek the salvation of the unsaved and the entire sanctification of believers.

155.4. To foster a progressive and continuous development of Christlike character, attitudes, and habits.

155.5. To lead to the discovery of a Christian philosophy of life, and the biblical interpretation of the universe.

155.6. To help the home become more effective in teaching the Christian faith.

155.7. To influence strongly in favor of church membership and to train for service in the same.

155.8. To reach the largest possible number of people for Christ and the church.

These objectives are to be accomplished through devout and diligent study and teaching of the Word of Ged—the Bible—and through any other contributive agencies.



#### P. The Board of Christian Life and Sunday School

156. Every local church shall have a Board of Christian Life and Sunday School composed of the chairman, [186A, 157A] and three to nine persons elected at the annual church meeting. The patient NWMS presidem, and the NYI president, the direcand admit ministries shall be ex officio nembers of the Board of Christian Life and Sunday School. All members shall serve until the close of the next year and until their ancessors are elected and qualified, and other children's, youth, and adult ministries.

156.1. In local churches of 50 members or less the church board may function as the Board of Christian Life and Sunday School. [138]

156.2. A vacancy on the Board of Christian Life and Sunday School may be filled at a duly called church meeting.

156.3. If desired, the elected members of the Board of Christian Life and Sunday School may be designated at the annual church meeting as an integral part of the church board, thus functioning as a committee on education of the church board.

156.4. If a committee on education is thus elected, the church may elect fewer stewards and trustees (though never less than the minimum established by the *Manual*, 143 and 148) or elect a larger church board than otherwise, [12.2, 3.136,28, 138]

156.5. The chairman of the Board of Christian Life and Sunday School shall be a member of the local church whose church school he serves, and shall be in the experience of entire sanctification, and in full sympathy with the doctrine and polity of the Church

of the Nazarene. He shall be a member ex officio of the Board of Christian Life and Sunday School, the church board, and the District Assembly held immediately prior to his year of office. He shall submit a annual report to the annual church meeting, and a quarterly report to the church board. [38, 112.7, 134, 239, 339]

To submit one or more nominations (the chairman not being present when the nominees are selected) approved by the pastor to the annual church meeting for chairman of the Board of Christian Life and Sunday School, who shall be elected by ballot of majority vote of said annual church meeting. The chairman shall be an ex officio member of the church board. The chairman may be redected by a "yea" and "no" vote when such election is ordered by the Board of Christian Life and Sunday School and approved by the pastor. A vacancy in the office of chairman of the Board of Christian Life and Sunday School shall be filled by the local church at a duly called church meeting.

To nominate to the church based with the approval of the pastor a director of children's ministries, a director of youth ministries who may be the NYI president, and a director of adult ministries. 157.12. To organize and promote, where practicable and with the approval of the pastor, a vacation Bible school and Christian Service Training classes; to select workers for them and have general super-

157.13. To elect officers and workers to carry out other sge-group ministries upon nomination by the director and with approval of the pastor.

To elect a local director of Christian Service Training, who shall promote the cause of Christian training, arrange training classes for the entire membership of the church, and have general supervision over the same; and to elect a dean or superintendent of the Christian Service Training school or special school, when such school is organized. 158. Director of Children's Ministries. The duties

of the local director of children's ministries shall be: 158.1. To plan, administer, supervise, and coordinate an active ministry by and for children from birth through 11 years.

158.2. To serve as superintendent of the children's division of the Sunday school

158.3. To be responsible for other Sunday and weekday educational, worship, evangelistic, and social programs for children.

158.4. To recommend to the Board of Christian Life and Sunday School for approval the curriculum and other resources to be used.

158.6. To provide leadership training for children's workers in cooperation with the director of Christian Service Training.

188.8. Graded children's churches may be organized when practical in the local church. The churches (nursery, kindergarten, primary, middler, and junice) shall be under the general supervision of the Board of Christian Life and Sunday School or the ducuation committee, the care of the pastor, and the immediate leadership of the local children's church directs.

158.9. Children's church members shall be those children who attend a children's worship service planned on their level of understanding. These services are usually held on Sunday morning during the regular worship service.

159. Director of Youth Ministries. The duties of the local director of youth ministries will be:

159.8. In the case of a local church designating that hired staff be given youth ministry responsibility, the local church board may designate the staff member as director of youth ministries.

 Director of Adult Ministries. The duties of the local director of adult ministries shall be:

160.1. To plan, administer, supervise, and coordinate an active ministry by and for adults from marriage or 24 years of age to death.

160.2. To serve as superintendent of the adult division of the Sunday school.

160.3. To be responsible for other Sunday and weekday educational, worship, evangelistic, service,

and social programs by and for adults.

160.4. To recommend to the Board of Christian Life and Sunday School for approval the curriculum and other resource materials to be used.

160.5. To nominate to the Board of Christian Life and Sunday School the leadership for the various adult ministries, including Sunday school teachers and officers. The nominees shall be approved by the pastor and the chairman of the Board of Christian Life and Sunday School

160.6. To provide leadership training for workers with adults in cooperation with the director of Christian Service Training.

160.7. To chair the adult council composed of the adult Sunday school supervisors and/or teachers and directors of: marriage and family life, senior adult ministries (including Home Department), single adult ministries, small-group Bible studies, lay retreats, service personnel, women's ministries, and any others deemed necessary.

### Q. The Sunday School

162. The Sunday school shall be under the general supervision of the Board of Christian Life and Sunday School, the care of the pastor and the immediate leadership of three age-division directors who in the Sunday school function as superintendents—children's, youth, and adult. [157,5]

162.1. Bylaws. Each Sunday school shall be organized and administered under the bylaws in 812.

### T. The Local Nazarene Youth International

171. Youth in the local church may be organized into units of the Nazarene Youth International for the spiritual benefit of young people, cooperation in bringing youth to Christ, and equipping them for the advancement of the work of the church.

171.1. The local units of the Nazarene Youth International may be organized into divisions as needed and shall be in harmony with the constitution for the local society as approved by the General Assembly. [810,1]

171.2. The local Nazarene Youth International shall be amenable to the local church and pastor.

### CHAPTER III

## THE REGION

#### A. Origin and Purpose

280. In the growth of the church worldwide, there has developed a grouping of several organized districts into geographical areas identified as regions. These regions are calustering of districts anneable to general government, providing, on the one hand, a sense of area and cultural identification so that their peoples have an awareness of regresentation in the life of the interactional church, and on the other hand, a grouping of sufficient size and strength to perform such functions as may be assigned to them.

### B. Functions

280.1. The present principal duties of the regions are:

### C. The Time and Place of Meeting

392. The General Assembly shall meet in the month of June, very fourth year, at such time and place as shall be determined by a General Assembly Commission composed of the general superinterdents and an equal number of persons chosen by the Board of General Superintendents. The general superinterdents and said commission shall also have power, in case of an emergency, to change the time and place of the meeting of the General Assembly. [992:12-2:3]

### E. General Assembly Arrangements Committee

304. The General Secretary, the General Treasurer, and three persons appointed by the Board of General Superintendents at least one year before the convening of the General Assembly shall constitute the General Assembly Arrangements Committee.

304.1. The General Assembly Arrangements Committee shall have authority to arrange all necessary details regarding offices, exhibits and space, entertainment and meals, and whatever else may be needful to contribute to the confort, convenience, and efficiency of the General Assembly, and enter into contracts necessary to provide the same.

304.2. 376.7. The profits from the operation of the Nazarene Publishing House shall be used as directed by the Department of Publication and the General Board, but always retaining a cash reserve equivalent to three months 'operational expense. 168 [\$376.8]

The operation of the Nazarene Publishing House is to be self-supporting; and if for any reason this is not the case, then it will be the responsibility of the Department of Publication jointly with the Board of General Superintendents and the General Board to decide on the supmorprista action.

THE GENERAL CHURCH PROPERTIES COMMITTEE

380. There shall be a General Church Properties Committee appointed by the Board of General Superintendents to provide the general oversight of the general church properties. This committee shall be convened at the call of the Board of General Superintendents.

CHAPTER II

## THE EVANCELIST

## I. CHURCH DISCIPLINE

500. The object of church discipline is not the punishment of definders, but vindication of the truth, purification of the church, warning of the careless, and reformation and salvation of the guilty. Members of the church who do violence to the General or Special Rolles, or who willfully and continuously violate their membership rows, should be dealt with their offenses. But, according to the grievourses of their offenses.

Holiness of heart and life being the New Testament standard, the Church of the Nazarese insists upon a clean ministry, and requires that those who hear its credentials as ministers be orthodox in doctrine and holy in life. SILS. A minister or layman shall not be required to answer charges for any act which occurred more than five years before the filing of such charges, and no evidence will be considered at any bearing for any matter which occurred more than five years before the charges were filed.

#### 810. CONSTITUTIONS FOR NAZARENE YOUTH INTERNATIONAL

810.1. Local Organization

ARTICLE I. Name

The president, vice-president, socretary, treasurer, mission education secretary, and publicity secretary shall constitute the executive committee and shall be elected by ballot annually by members of the society. All other secretaries may be elected by the society or ap-

All other secretaries may be elected by the society or appointed by the executive committee. The pastor shall be an ex officio member of the NWMS executive committee.

These efficers and secretaries, together with chapter chairmen, children and youth supervisors, and pastor, shall constitute the local NWMS council. Any duly elected District NWMS Council member shall

ARTICLE VIL Funds

SECTION 1. General Budget

All funds raised by this society for the General Budget shall be sent direct to the General Treasurer.

### CHAPTER III

# 812. BYLAWS OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL

#### PURPOSE.

The purpose of the Sunday school is basically threefold: 1. To teach the Word of God effectively until pupils are saved, sanctified wholly, and maturing in Christian expresence.

 To help Christians grow spiritually by involving them in a reaching, teaching, and soul-winning ministry.
To locate and visit unchurched member until they

To locate and visit unchurched people until they become enrolled and regular in attendance.

### ARTICLE L. Membership

SHITNON 1. Membership in the Sunday school of the Church of the Nazarene is open to all who desire the help and association this school offers and who consent to beccure members under the provision of the Manual and thus bylaws. There shall be four classes of members; namely, Sanday school, outreach, Cradle Roll, and Home Department. [162]

Suc. 2. All persons who declare their willingness to attend with some degree of regularity are eligible for Sunday school membership and may be enrolled at once.

SEC. 3. Sunday school members should be dropped from the roll immediately when they join another Sunday school, move out of town, die, or specifically ask to have their names



removed. Members who have ceased to attend but who still live in the community should be removed only after every effort has been made by the teacher, supervisor, superintendent, and pastor to gain their attendance. A nonattending nomber may be transferred to another class upon recommendation of the supervisor and/or superintendent in the interest of gaining his regular attendance. Nonattending upstor, non-

SiN', 4. Cradle roll members shall be children under four years of app, enrolled in the Cradle Roll department, who do not attend Swaday school. Cradle Roll members shall be enrolled by the Cradle Roll members are a part of the total Sunday school enrollment, just as are Home Department members.

All children on the Cradle Roll should be considered as prospects for the Nursery Department. The parents of these children are prospects for the Young Adult Department or class.

Any children on the Cradle Roll who have not started attending Sunday school by their fourth birthday should be transferred to the prospect list of the Kindergarten Department.

Children remain on the Craffe Rell audit they come to Sunday school with some regularity. Thy are then escaled movery one (collens), marked for their age—questry critic numery one (collens), marked yes, or numery three. When emploid in the Numery Department, they are taken off the Craffe Rell and placed on a class roll. They are counted in the Sunday school's enrollment, and in the attendance when they are present.

It is recommended that the Cradle Roll be sponsored as a project by a young married people's Sunday school class, or a young married people's department.

SEC. 5. Home Department members shall be enrolled by the supervisor of the Home Department, or the director of senior adult ministries, who may also be serving as super302 [¶812]

When Home Department members are present in the Sun-day school, they should be counted as visitors in the class where they attend

# ARTICLE II. Attendance

SECTION 1. Sunday school attendance represents the number of different persons studying the Bible each week during a regular Sunday school hour session. Outreach type or other related ministries (such as nursing homes, daycare centers, weekday Bible studies, Christian schools, etc.) should be reported separately and should not be counted as Sunday school. Attendance counts shall be closed not later than the halfway point of the Sunday school sessions. This shall also apply to unified or special services.

SEC. 2. All regular Sunday school sessions shall be used in determining the average attendance for the year.

The number of sessions used to determine Sunday school average attendance shall also be used to determine outreach average.
